Air Products Expands Newcastle Operations



Started in 1969, Air Products South Africa (Pty) Ltd. has positioned themselves as the largest suppliers in on-site and pipeline liquid and gaseous product market, supplying gases such as oxygen, nitrogen, argon, hydrogen and carbon dioxide. Catering for small to large consumption, their product offering includes specialised chemical products such as polymers, polyurethane, performance and industrial chemicals used in the manufacture of adhesives, agrochemicals, aquaculture, civil engineering, cryogenics, electronics, metals, rubber & plastics, nonwovens & textiles, petrochemicals, fats & oils, industrial cleaners, to mention but a few. In addition to their highly specialised products they also provide comprehensive services which include a customer process consultancy, installation, maintenance inspection of gas equipment, customer gas site management.

With an increased demand from one of their clients in the metal industry, Air Products has em-

barked on the expansion of their Newcastle facility, which includes a new distillation column or 'cold box' which is used to separate oxygen and nitrogen from the air. The 54.7 metre high, 168-ton unit, being 5.5 by 4.4 metres wide was manufactured by Air Products in Wales and shipped to Richards Bay. From there it was transported a further 300km by abnormal-load trailers to the site. Target Cranes' Wadeville branch was assigned to assist in the erection of the cold box in September 2008, an arduous task requiring the precise positioning on the 1.5 metre deep concrete slab with 36 bolts. The LG 1550 was used with a 77m main boom, Derrick boom and full super lift counterweight of 250 ton, where the carrier had a 160 ton counterweight. The cold box was placed on a 25m radius with the cranes capacity being 175 tons at this distance.

Guidelines for Hand Signals

Hand signals are the primary form of communication between crane operator and riggers but for it to be effective, certain guidelines must be applied.

- A crane operator should always move loads according to the established code of signals, and use a signaller. Hand signals are preferred and commonly used.
- Only a qualified person should give signals to the crane operator. There should be only one designated person at a time giving crane signals.
- A crane operator should move loads only on crane signals from one person.
- A crane operator must obey STOP signals no matter who gives it.
- The person giving crane signals must be in clear view of the crane operator.
- The person giving crane signals must have a clear view of the load and the equipment,
- The person giving crane signals must keep persons outside the crane's operating area. Any request or questions should be addressed to the signaller.
- The person giving crane signals should never direct a load over a person.
